

Governor Walz Supplemental Budget Proposal Transportation 2022

Matching Funds for IIJA

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• The proposal includes \$40M/year or \$80M in FY22-23 and \$80M in FY24-25, for the modes for both formula match and discretionary grants:

Based on the current assumptions, below is a rough breakdown:

- \$7M/year for greater MN transit
- \$10M/year for Met Council for Twin Cities transit
- \$6.5M/year for aeronautics
- \$3.4M/year for EV infrastructure
- Remaining ~\$13M/year TBD, available for discretionary grants
- For the remaining new state funds (\$200M in 22/23, \$293M in 24/25), would flow through HUTD and these splits for TH/CSAH/MSAS:

FY22-23 TH - \$117.8M CSAH - \$65.1M MSAS - \$17.1M FY24-25 TH - \$172.7M CSAH - \$95.4M MSAS - \$25M

 For Trunk Highway, the spending also includes the ~70% portion of the new federal road and bridge funds for MnDOT SRC

 THF Expenditures:

 FY22-23: \$433.2M
 FY24-45: \$533.4M

- Across the 4 years of the proposal, breakdown of TH spending:
 - SRC +\$890M (\$222M/year)
 - IIJA federal funds +\$676M (\$169M/year)
 - New state funds for match +\$214M (\$53M/year)
 - Program planning and delivery +\$36M (\$12M/year)
 - Ops and maintenance +\$29M (\$7M/year)

- Agency services +\$12M (\$4M/year)
- Of all the new TH spending (state + federal), +\$967M (\$242M/year), with ~92% to SRC for projects and ~8% for delivery, maintenance, and oversight needs
- Federal Climate Funding Match

FY22-23: \$2M FY24-25: \$4M

MnDOT Budget

• Operating Compensation increase

The Governor recommends increasing the Department of Transportation's operating appropriation to fund employee cost-of-living increases provided in labor contracts.

FY22-23: \$23.9M - THF FY24-25: \$40.8M - THF

• AMER Radio Tower

FY22-23: \$2M

• Rail Grade Crossing Safety

FY22-23: \$1.5M FY24-25: \$3M

• Utility Aircraft Replacement

FY22-23: \$7M

• Blue Line LRT Extension

FY22-23: \$200M

• Zero Emission Transit Bus Transition

FY22-23: \$3.2M
