

In 1911, twenty-one year old carpenter, Edward Kraemer, began his own business in a small village in Wisconsin. Edward entered the road and bridge business in the early 1920s, as automotive travel began to flourish, and Sauk County, WI, sought contractors to build county roads. The companies growth was significantly aided by FDR's New Deal throughout the 1930s and 40s, as Kraemer began acquiring quarry leases, heavy equipment and road contracts. In the 1950s, the company experienced rapid expansion as the road building industry matured and the company expanded to construction contracts on a state and national level. The 1960s through the 1980s brought a lot of "firsts" for the company, including its first Minnesota project - the 10th Avenue Bridge.
