

In 1900, internationally recognized hydroelectric and hydraulic engineering expert, Daniel W. Mead, founded what would become the consulting firm known as Mead & Hunt. It was not until the early 1920s, when electrical and civil engineer, Henry Hunt, joined the fold and became a partner, thus forming the namesake. The partnership enabled the company to grow, diversifying into other areas of engineering and architecture.

"The firm's services expanded to meet the country's changing social needs. Civil and highway engineering were added as interstate highway networks were created. Airport planning and design supported the military during the 1940s. After World War II, the firm's services grew to include architectural, structural, mechanical and electrical engineering when new housing, commercial and industrial buildings were needed. And this growth and expansion has continued."

Today, Mead & Hunt is ranked as one of the top 150 consulting firms in the country by ENR and was named among the top 25 best civil engineering firms to work for in the country by CE News. They are also a leading consulting engineer for the transportation industry.
