

HNTB's rich history traces back to 1914 when Ernest Emmanuel Howard established the partnership that would later become HNTB. The firm endured through the Great Depression with federally funded infrastructure projects such as the Harlem River Bridge. In 1941 the firm adopted its name, meanwhile broadening its scope to include highway design and aviation on its way to becoming a leader in the transportation industry. The 1956 Federal Aid Highway Act spurred further diversification in transportation services for HNTB, and acquisitions in the 1970s positioned the firm as one of the most successful national engineering and architecture practices in the country. Further acquisitions in the 1980s enabled HNTB to serve the rail industry and engage in a period of global expansion.

2014 marked HNTB's 100th year of providing infrastructure solutions. Currently, the firm is a leading consulting engineer for the transportation industry.
