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### Project Readiness

- During the 2023 Legislative Session, several changes were made to the Corridors of Commerce statute (MN Statute 161.086).
- One of the changes included the addition of allowing the Commissioner to allocate up to 10% of CoC funds available in each fiscal year for Readiness Advancement Activities (project readiness) on potential future CoC project candidates.
- From the COC4 funding, \$22M was reserved for project readiness activities.
- Project readiness activities are identified as planning, scoping, predesign, preliminary engineering, and environmental analysis.

# **Project Readiness Phases**

Phase	Description
Phase 1: Project Solicitation	Project recommendations will be taken by an online submittal process from individuals, businesses, local governments, corridor groups, or other interested groups
Phase 2: Local Screening & Recommendations	Local screening groups will:  1. Review all the potential candidates;  2. Seek input from members of the legislature regarding their non-binding approval or disapproval of a project; &  3. Recommend which projects proceed to Phase 3
Phase 3: Project Scoring	Projects will be scored based upon the eight scoring criteria in the COC law.
Phase 4: Project Ranking & Selection	Project must be selected based upon their scored order.
Phase 5: Public Information	Information regarding the projects submitted, their final scores, and the selected projects for award must be available publicly on MnDOT's website.

## **Project Readiness Timelines**

- Phase 1, Project Solicitation: March July
- Phase 2, Local Screening Body Recommendations: April September
- Phase 3, Project Scoring: July October
- Phase 4, Project Ranking & Selection: October November
- Phase 5, Public Information: November December





# **Capital Programs Update**

#### IIJA Impact on Capital Program

- The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) provides Minnesota's capital program with significant funding increase from 2022 through 2026.
- Funding increased through formula, non-formula, and competitive grants.
  - Formula funding: Provided funding increase through the core-formula programs.
  - Bridge non-formula funding: Provided funding for bridge projects, which frees up the department's resources for other needs.
  - Competitive Grants: Minnesota received a significant share of funding from multiple grants authorized by IIJA.

#### Largest IIJA Grants Minnesota Received

- Blatnik bridge \$1.06 Billion for a FFY22&23 MPDG/INFRA award
- I-494 EZ Pass Lane \$138M for a FFY25&26 MPDG/INFRA award
- TH 19 in Northfield \$25.5M for a FFY25&26 MPDG/RURAL award
- I-90 Austin Bridges \$25M for a FFY22 MPDG/INFRA award
- TH 210 in Brainerd \$25M for a FFY23&24 MPDG/RURAL award
- TH 3 Robert Street \$25M for a FFY25 Round 1 award

### Heading into the Future


- 2026 is the last year of IIJA.
- This means the new 2026-2029 STIP includes only one year of IIJA funding.
- Beyond 2026, the new STIP assumes:
  - Non-core formula programs will most likely be terminated.
  - The core formula program funding will remain at historical funding rate for 2027 through 2029.
