Some Accomplishments Since 2006

- Passage of the constitutional amendment dedicating the sales tax on motor vehicles to transportation and adding over \$2 billion in funding since 2007.
- Leadership of the successful campaign to convince lawmakers to pass a major Transportation Funding Package (Chapter 152) in 2008. This comprehensive funding bill — worth over \$5 billion to date — included permanent increases in constitutionally dedicated funding along with local sales tax options for counties, allowing major highway, bridge and transit projects to be completed throughout the state.
- Increased funding for the Local Bridge Program (over \$380 million since 2006) and Local Road Improvement Program (over \$400 million since 2006) through lobbying efforts that kept legislators informed about projects in their districts and the need for significant resources. Hundreds of local governments — counties, cities and townships — have benefitted from millions of dollars in funding.
- Passage of legislation dedicating the sales tax on leased vehicles, rental vehicles and auto repair parts to transportation along with \$1.3 billion authorized in Trunk Highway Bonds (\$670 million for State Road Construction and \$700 million for Corridors of Commerce).
- Brought hundreds of transportation industry advocates together with decision makers at our Transportation Day at the Capitol, Washington, DC Fly-In and Annual Membership and Construction Forecast events.
